Forest Oaks Homeowner's Association Meeting

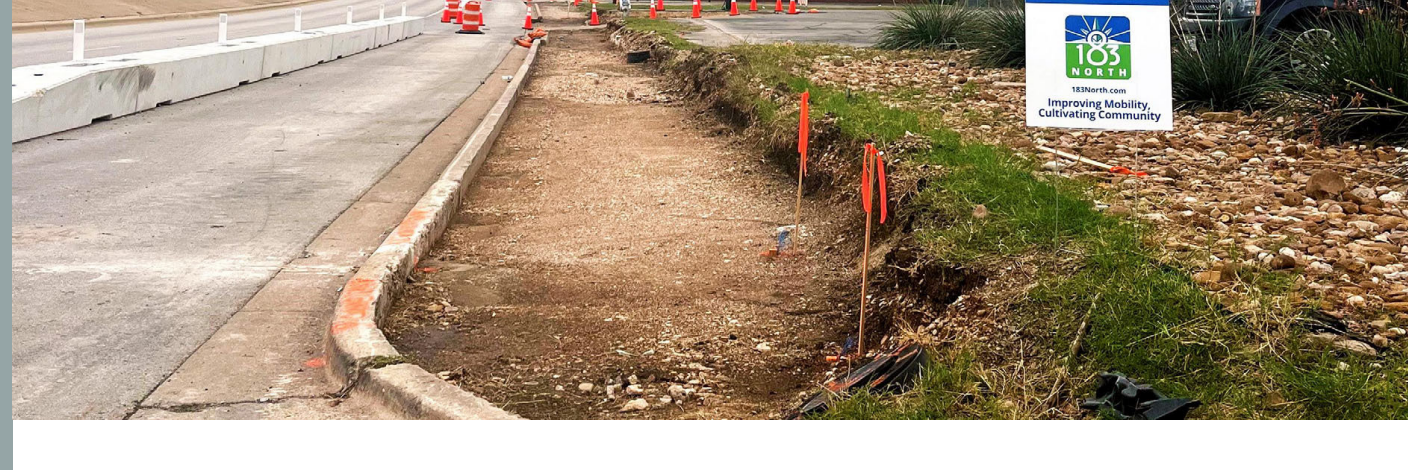

What You'll See on the Road

Commuters along the project corridor may notice that business driveway entrances along the frontage roads are being reconstructed to accommodate the new sidewalks that are included in the 183 North Mobility Project. When the project is complete, sidewalks will be ADA-compliant, widened up to 5-foot and continuous along the 183 North Mobility Project corridor.

The 183 North Mobility Project values our business community and aims to minimize impacts from construction wherever feasible. Our outreach team has already begun working with individual businesses to alert them to the driveway reconstruction schedule and to offer "Open for Business" signage, where needed, at no charge to the business.

The Mobility Authority places high priority on customer satisfaction, transparency and trust, and is committed to being a partner in the community. We aim to work proactively with commuters and residents through the construction process and beyond. The 183 North Mobility Project team will begin outreach this year to residents impacted by MoPac sound wall reconstruction.

The MoPac sound wall will be partially removed in sections to allow for improvements to the direct connector, from U.S. 183, traveling southbound to MoPac, and to accommodate a new access ramp at that location. Our goal is to share information on the work and what residents can expect. Thank you for your patience and understanding as we bring improvements to this area.

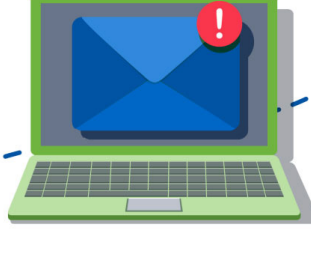

RM 620 U-Turn Closure

As of October 10, 2022, Great Hills Constructors closed the U.S. 183 U-turn at RM 620, for the U.S. 183 northbound to southbound traffic movement. Drivers traveling northbound and needing to turnaround and travel southbound on U.S. 183 or the frontage road, will be able to turn left at the traffic light at the RM 620 intersection, instead of using the U-turn. The closure of the U-turn will be continuous, 24 hours a day, seven days a week and will last approximately one year. This closure will allow construction vehicles to access the U.S. 183 median, thereby increasing safety and reducing the potential for future traffic delays as the 183 North Mobility Project progresses.
