



What's Happening on the Road?

What a summer it was along the 183 North Mobility Project corridor! Crews have been working hard all year along the US 183 mainlanes, median and frontage roads. We thought we'd recap some of the many activities underway for you.

Much of the work has been focused on utility relocations, as well as sidewalk and related business driveway reconstructions as a part of the Mobility Authority's dedication to ensuring all sidewalks along the frontage roads are updated to become ADA compliant.

There has been an ongoing U-Turn closure at RM 620 to allow construction vehicles and crews access to the center median. This minimizes interference with traffic on the mainlanes while increasing safety and reduces the potential for traffic delays. Those needing to utilize a turnaround in that area can turn left at the traffic light at the RM 620 intersection.

Crews are working to complete interior and exterior widening along US 183 northbound and southbound frontage and mainlanes, as well as sections of MoPac near US 183.

Crews are also working on various drainage improvements to the frontage roads to allow for construction of the outside widening, as well as improved drainage along the frontage roads

As you can see, crews have been busy this year and continue to move forward as we are looking toward the end of 2023. Check out the Major Activities page to learn more and see what the rest of 2023 and early 2024 looks like.

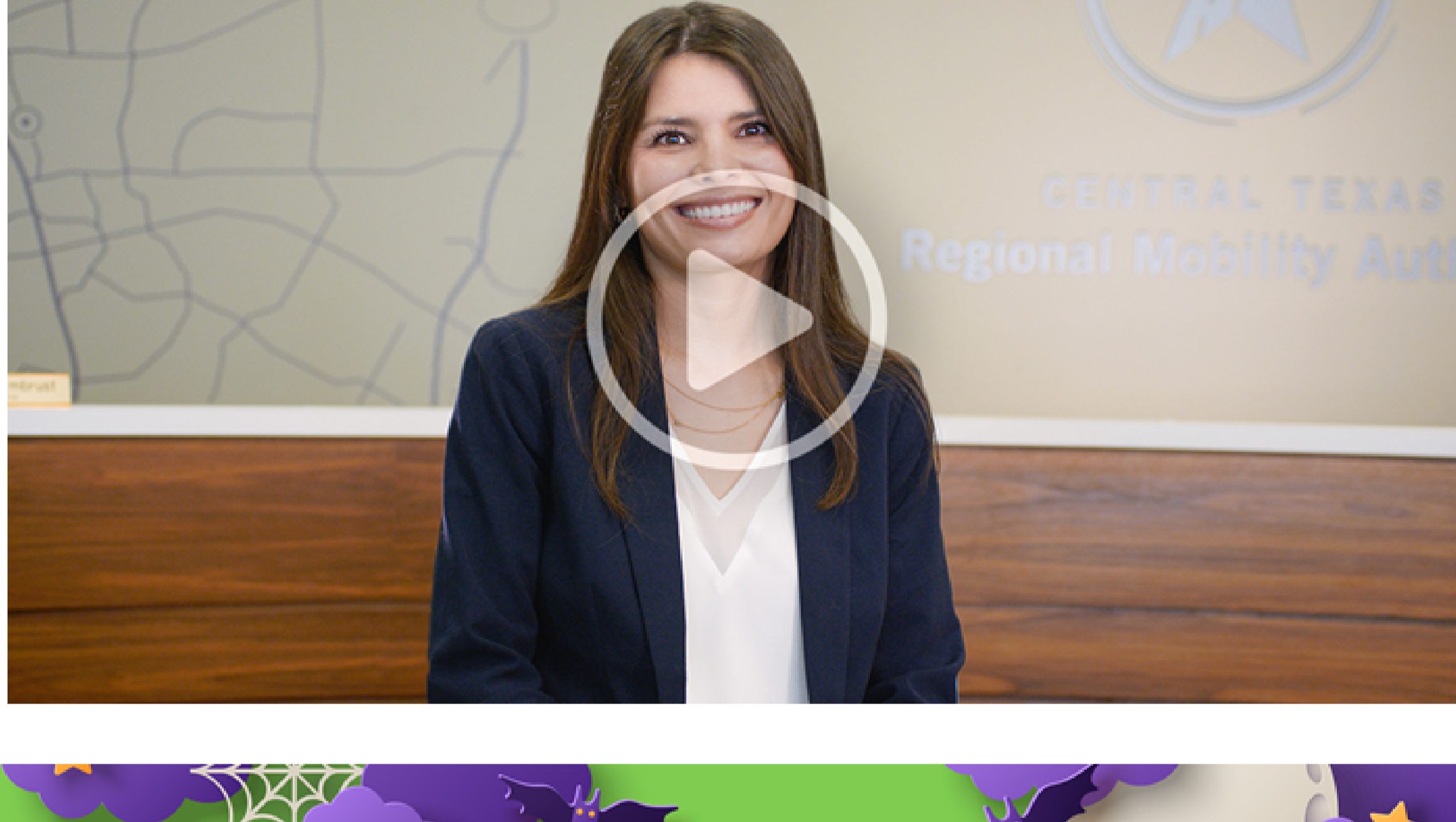

Are you ready for Halloween? While Halloween is a fun and exciting time for a lot of children, it can be a stressful and frustrating time for parents and drivers. With higher pedestrian traffic in the evening and everyone rushing to get home for Trick or Treating, roadways have the potential to become a bit more challenging than normal during this holiday. Check out the following safety tips provided by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration:

Safety Tips for Drivers

- Be alert for trick-or-treaters on Halloween. Slow down and continue to scan the road in areas where they are likely to be or where sight distances are limited.
- On Halloween there will likely be more pedestrians on the roads and in places where they are not expected. Slower speeds save lives.
- Stay alert for pedestrians who may come out from between parked cars or behind shrubbery. Stop, wait for them to pass.
- Don't look at your phone when you're driving. Your attention needs to always be on the road.
- If you see a drunk driver on the road, contact law enforcement.

Safety Tips for Pedestrians

- Walk on a sidewalk if one is available and use crosswalks.
- Before the Halloween festivities begin, create a "buddy system" to get each other home safely and prevent walking alone.
- Make sure to wear reflective or light-colored clothing and consider carrying a flashlight so you're more visible to drivers and other trick-or-treaters.

In the community

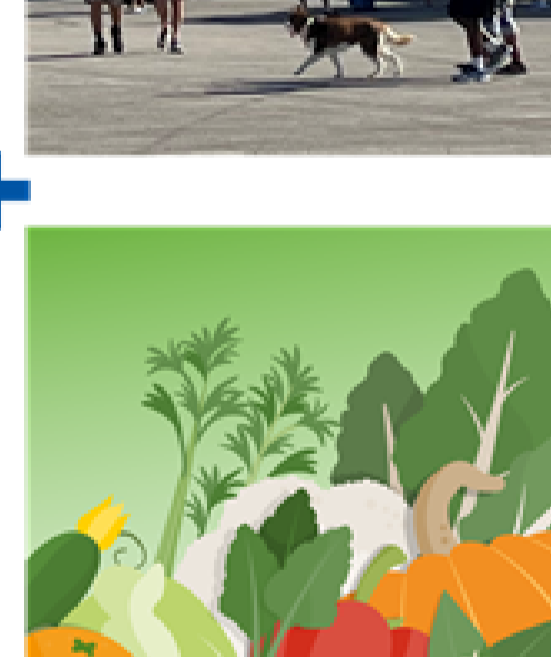
