To assist with ease of transit and timely travel to your holiday destinations, crews will pause all lane closures (with the exception of some long-term closures) from December 23rd through 26th.

## Holiday Travel

Did you know that while the holidays bring a lot of joy and time with friends and family, this season is also one of the most dangerous to drive in? Changing weather and plans, parties and plenty of distractions means drivers need to be prepared and extra cautious to stay safe this holiday season. Check out the following tips from the **United States Department of Transportation** and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to keep you safe on the roads.



**1. Always drive 100% sober.** Even one alcoholic beverage could be one too many. If it's your turn to be the designated driver, take your job seriously and don't drink. If you see a drunk driver on the road, contact 911.

**2. Plan ahead.** Before you have even one drink, designate a sober driver to get you home safely. If you wait until you've been drinking to make this decision, you might not make the best one. If you have a friend who is about to drink and drive, take the keys away and let a sober driver get your friend home safely.



**3. Avoid distractions.** Don't use your cell phone to text, email, or access social media while driving. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for at least five seconds. At 55 miles per hour, that is like driving the length of an entire football field with your eyes closed. Safe driving requires your full attention.

**4. Check the weather.** Be prepared before heading out on the road, and make sure to drive at a speed that is safe for road and weather conditions.



By planning ahead, making smart decisions and being aware of your surroundings, you can enjoy the holiday season and the travel that comes with it safely.
