







Year in Review: 2022

The 183 North Mobility Project is a design-build project, much of the work in early to mid-2022 was centered on final design and obtaining permits that are required for construction activities. Over the spring and early summer of 2022, work focused on installation of high mast lighting along US 183, construction of median access points and pavement grinding on the US 183 general-purpose lanes. Groundwork for the express lanes, driveways, and sidewalks reconstruction began in late 2022 and will go into 2023. In 2023 the project work will also include structure work/bridge widening, work on the direct connector between US 183 and MoPac, as well as the collector-distributor road along MoPac and pavement work in the center median.

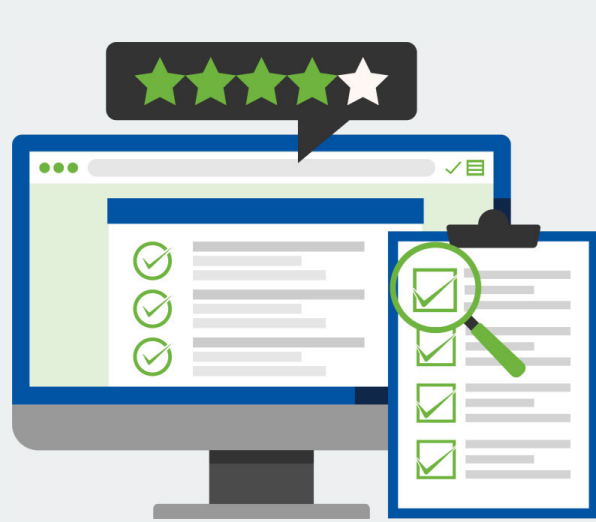
Public Opinion Survey
